

Program Expectations





Being present for success: attendance is required; Responsible for missed materials/ make-up assignments; no reading break

Instructor will have animals attend virtually on occasion as 'teacher's aide'


Animal Care Aide Certificate

Apply theory to practice with hands-on sessions in specialized facilities including 20 hours of mandatory work experience.
