Community Impact Statistics

- 22 participants self-identified as First Nations
- 23 girls
- 35 participants received a subsidized registration
- 3 instructors hired
- 8 camps
- 5 North Island communities
- 6 community partners: CIRA, Navigate, NVIATS, CRCIC, APEG, and CSJ
- 4 community members sponsored a low income youth to attend at no cost

Thanks to generous funding from our community partners, **139 students, ages 9 to 12**, had the opportunity to build, program and remotely control Lego robots at a series of summer camps in Port Alberni, the Comox Valley, Ucluelet Port Hardy and Campbell River.

Students **learned vital science, technology, engineering and math (STEM) skills, required for many careers.** In the fall of 2016, these same students will have access to the robots through NIC's Remote Web-based Science Labs (RWSL), allowing students to continue to hone their programming skills.
