For Non-Cohort Classes

Faculty Member: Have your students achieved **all the essential learning outcomes** for your course?



Wrap up the Course

If students have achieved all the essential/core learning outcomes for a course and do not require any more classes, then wrap up the course. Start by communicating to students what is happening. Adjust your grading schemes, mark remaining assignments, determine a final grade and close off the course. Inform your dean and chair of this situation so students know your course is complete.

Consider Alternate Delivery Methods and Compressed Learning

If you do not need to provide scheduled classes anymore, but students are not done demonstrating all course learning outcomes, consider alternative forms of delivery and assessment to wrap up the course. At NIC, you can use Blackboard Learn to: share slide decks, PDFs, documents, links etc.; facilitate discussions; give quizzes; allow students to upload assignments; provide grade information. You can also use email, telephone, or BlueJeans web conferencing platform to communicate with your students.
