Do I need my own computer?

Many of our students find it valuable to have their own computer as it provides the most flexibility in terms of working environment. However, the NIC Comox Valley campus houses two computer labs in Raven 107 and 212, equipped with iMac workstations, all required program software and a scanner and printer that both in-person (CVS) and online (DLU) registered students are permitted to access.

MAC Lab Hours of Operation:

Saturday: 10:00 - 4:00 Sunday: no access

Should I get a PC or a Mac?

Typically, a Mac is considered industry standard. That said, you will not be at a disadvantage if you choose a Windows system instead. They both have strengths and weaknesses, you can read about the pros and cons of each here.

Should I get a laptop or a desktop?

Either will work. Laptops provide mobility but have smaller screens. Desktops have larger screens but lack mobility. If you will be working on the iMacs in the lab while on campus and on your own computer at home, a desktop is probably the best option. If you want to work outside of the labs on campus, in a cafe, at home on the couch, then a laptop is the right choice. You can always buy a second monitor to make up for the limited screen size.
