Offshore international applicants to NIC are required to meet the above deadlines. For international applicants who are already in Canada with a valid study permit, alternate dates may apply.

Applications may close without notice if programs are full. Prospective students are encouraged to submit their application as soon as the application window opens.

Do I need an agent?

If you are from India, Bangladesh, Pakistan, Philippines, Nepal, Sri Lanka or Nigeria, you are required to work with an NIC authorized agent. To find an agent, visit international.nic.bc.ca

ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

General admission requirements for international applicants:

- A passport that is valid until the end of your scheduled program
- High School Graduation or equivalent (include transcripts and graduation diploma)
- IELTS 6.0 or equivalent
 (Some programs may require higher IELTS scores. See Admission Requirements for more information at nic.bc.ca/international)

Math requirements:

Students who do not meet math requirements to enter their chosen programs are offered to complete a free math assessment after the deposit payment is made.

Science requirements:

Students entering the Associate of Science or Engineering Foundation programs are required to have completed courses equivalent to grade 12 math and science. If you do not have the required courses/grades, you may enter NIC's Associate degree program and upgrade your math and science.








PW3.2 completion (level 15)
