Living and Studying at NIC

Tuition, Textbooks and Supplies

NIC charges tuition based on credits. As new NIC international students you are required to pay a one-term or two-term tuition deposit before receiving the Letter of Acceptance.

Books and other supplies are not included in the tuition deposit and must be paid separately upon or before arrival. Estimated cost of the program can be found online.

Work while you study

As an international student, you may be allowed to work up to 20 hours per week during regular academic sessions, and full-time during scheduled breaks in winter and summer. Many businesses in NIC campus areas hire NIC students regularly. Our provincial minimum wage is \$15.20 per hour as of September 2021. Students working full-time in a co-op/internship position may earn up to \$10,000 during the scheduled break term.

Admission to NIC

Once you have chosen your program, determine your eligibility by reviewing the admission requirements outlined for your desired program. Then, simply gather the necessary information and prepare to apply!

Choose your program of study

Check the available intakes and additional admission requirements.

Apply online

Go to educationplannerbc.ca to submit your online application along with your supporting documents.

3

Make the tuition payment

Our admissions team will assess your documents and send you a Letter of Invitation. Follow the steps in the letter to submit any outstanding documents and make the tuition deposit payment to secure your seat in the program.

4

Apply for study permit

Submit your study permit application together with Letter of Acceptance.

Minimum Admission Requirement

- 18 years of age prior to or within the first term of study
- High school graduation or equivalent
- Meet the minimum English proficiency requirement (see below)
- Post-graduate programs require successful completion of minimum 3-year degree from a recognized post-secondary institution
- You may be required to meet other academic and admission requirements for your chosen program (for example: Grade 11 math)

Do I need a counselor/agent?

If you are from India, Bangladesh, Pakistan, Nepal, Sri Lanka or Nigeria, you are required to work with an NIC authorized consultant. NIC collaborates with numerous recognized education and immigration consultants around the world who can assist with application, admission and preparation for studies at NIC.
