## SUPPLEMENTARY STUDENT MOBILITY AGREEMENT

#### BETWEEN:

### NORTH ISLAND COLLEGE ("NIC")

- and -

# THE UNIVERSITY OF MANITOBA ("UM")

WHEREAS the parties entered into a Memorandum of Understanding dated January, 2012;

AND WHEREAS the parties believe that the educational process at their respective institutions would be enriched and the learning experience of their respective students deepened through the establishment of a Student Mobility Agreement ("the program");

NOW THEREFORE in consideration of the following terms and conditions, the parties hereby agree as follows:

### 1.0 **Definitions**

In this Agreement:

Visiting Student shall mean a student registered at NIC who are taking one or more Courses at the UM on a letter of permission from NIC.

Student shall mean Visiting Student, NIC Graduate or Canadian Forces Member, unless otherwise specified;

Home institution shall mean the institution in which the student is enrolled as a candidate for a degree or from which the student has received a degree

Host institution shall mean the institution, which has agreed to receive the Visiting Students from the home institution;

Canadian Forces Member shall mean eligible Regular serving Members of the Canadian Forces and their spouses, and Class 'C' Reserve Forces.

Courses shall mean University of Manitoba Distance and Online Education Courses

UM DE shall mean University of Manitoba Distance and Online Education;

NIC Graduate shall mean an individual who has graduated from an NIC program that includes courses listed in Appendix 1;

Transfer Credit means academic credit given at the host institution for courses taken at the home institution

#### 2.0 Commencement and Duration

This Agreement shall commence as of the 1st day of January, 2012. The terms and conditions of this agreement will remain in effect for five (5) years from that date, subject to annual review and modification by agreement of both parties. The Agreement may be terminated prior to that date by either party giving six (6) months written notice to the other party or where an earlier termination date is mutually agreed upon. In the event of termination, the respective parties will honour all commitments to students currently participating activities pursuant to this Agreement.

# 3.0 Purpose and Scope

The purpose of this Agreement is to facilitate the virtual mobility of Students and the transfer of credits earned at NIC to the UM Faculty of Arts, as indicated in Appendix 1, which is attached hereto.

Within a one-year time frame, NIC will send a minimum of 3 Visiting Students to the University of Manitoba for Courses offered through Extended Education.

It is not necessarily expected that UM will host the same number of students in any one-year period.

## 4.0 Selection of Visiting Students

The home institution will determine Students to be issued Letters of Permission to enroll as Visiting Students in Courses at UM on the basis of the following criteria:

- 4.1 The student must have a good academic standing; and
- The student must have completed the required prerequisite courses.

#### 5.0 Enrolment and Student Status

### **Visiting Students**

- NIC Students who wish to concurrently enroll in UM DE Courses will apply and be admitted as Visiting Students at UM for those Courses.
- 5.2 Alternative Courses may be suggested by the student advisor in the event of restricted Course vacancies or Course cancellation.
- 5.3 The host institution reserves the right to approve individual Courses in which the Visiting Students are enrolled at the host institution.
- 5.4 If these Visiting Students wish to transfer their credit to UM they must apply for admission to UM as their home institution.
- 5.5 At the Visiting Student's request, the host institution will forward his/her final transcript to the designated office at the home institution. Credits obtained at the host institution toward the student's degree are to be awarded by the home institution, subject to degree regulations.

# **NIC Graduates**

- 5.6 NIC Graduates who apply for and are admitted to the UM Faculty of Arts will receive the Transfer Credits listed in Appendix 1 attached hereto into the Bachelor of Arts: Integrated Studies ("IS") or the Bachelor of Arts General degree, subject to degree requirements.
- 5.7 The list in Appendix 1 will be made available to Students.

#### 6.0 Institutional Student Fees

- 6.1 UM will waive the Visiting Student application fee for those Visiting Students enrolling in Courses and will roll forward the Visiting Student admission status so the Visiting Students will not have to re-apply each time they wish to take Courses.
- 6.2 NIC will waive the corresponding Letter of Permission fees for Visiting Students.
- 6.3 Except as otherwise provided herein, Students will pay normal UM tuition fees, based on their registered course load, to the host institution.
- 6.3 Students will be responsible for paying other fees required by the host institution such as student organization fees, transcript fees, and the costs for books.

### 7.0 Student Rights and Responsibilities

7.1 Visiting Students will have the same privileges provided to students of the host institution while enrolled in Courses.

Visiting Students will be subject to the rules, regulations, and discipline of the host institution while 7.2 enrolled in Courses.

#### Host Institution Student Assistance 8.0

- The host institution will provide ongoing advice and support for Visiting Students through the contact 8.1 person, as required.
- UM will offer the following services via the Extended Education's Military Support Office to Canadian 8.2 Forces Members studying as Visiting Students or who apply and are admitted as NIC Graduates at the UM:

evaluation of military education and training for advanced standing at UM; a)

reduced residency for serving members, their spouses, and members of Class 'C' Reserve Forces, b) in Bachelor of Arts General/Bachelor of Arts: IS (i.e., UM Canadian Forces Members are required to complete only a 12 credit hour residency toward their BA degrees, rather than the 30 credit hours normally required); and

assistance with applications for time extensions, authorized withdrawals, or deferred exams due c) to changes in deployments.

#### Indemnification 9.0

Each Party shall be liable for the actions of its own employees, officers, agents and representatives and shall save the other party harmless from any losses relating thereto.

#### 10.0 **Contact Persons**

Each institution will designate an individual who will serve as the contact person for this Agreement. The contact person will be responsible for coordinating the specific requests of the program, preparing and distributing reports on the progress of the exchange program, and advising and assisting students
