



MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING REGARDING BLOCK TRANSFER

Between North Island College (NIC)

and

Pacific Coast University for Workplace Health Sciences (PCU-WHS)

This memorandum of understanding constitutes an agreement between North Island College (NIC) and Pacific Coast University for Workplace Health Sciences (PCU-WHS) on the block transfer of credits.

1. Objective of the Agreement

Pacific Coast University for Workplace Health Sciences (PCU-WHS) agrees to facilitate block transfer for students who have completed an associate degree, 2-year diploma, or 60 transferable academic credits in a range of disciplines from North Island College (NIC) into the 3rd year of the Bachelor of Disability Management (BDM) at Pacific Coast University for Workplace Health Sciences (PCU-WHS). North Island College (NIC) students must achieve a minimum overall GPA of 2.0.

2. Articulation

By this agreement, applicants from North Island College (NIC) who completed the requirements outlined below will be eligible for admission to Pacific Coast University for Workplace Health Sciences (PCU-WHS), provided there is student capacity, with full block transfer as per the program admission requirements for the BDM program.

- Associate of Arts
- Associate of Science
- Business Administration Diploma
- Criminology Diploma
- Social Service Diploma
- Human Services Diploma
- 60 transferable credits including, but not limited to: 24 credits of 100+ level discretionary electives; 3 credits of 200+ level discretionary electives; 6 credits 100+ level Humanities/Social Sciences electives; 6 credits 100+ level Business electives; 6 credits 100+ level Health Sciences electives



3. Reciprocity

As a partner to this agreement, North Island College (NIC) agrees:

- To make information about this agreement and the BDM available to students.
- To provide the opportunity for representatives of Pacific Coast University for Workplace Health Sciences (PCU-WHS) to visit appropriate forums at North Island College (NIC) to disseminate information about the Pacific Coast University for Workplace Health Sciences (PCU-WHS) BDM program and funding options.

As a partner to the agreement, Pacific Coast University for Workplace Health Sciences (PCU-WHS) agrees:

- To facilitate students from North Island College (NIC) with 60 transferable academic credits block transfer and admission, provided there is student capacity to the 3rd year of the Pacific Coast University for Workplace Health Sciences (PCU-WHS) BDM program.
- To notify North Island College (NIC) with as much lead time as possible of any admission changes to the Pacific Coast University for Workplace Health Sciences (PCU-WHS) BDM program.

3. Liaison

This agreement will be implemented through the Registrar's Office at each institution, in consultation with the appropriate authorities in the respective programs.

4. Term of Agreement

This agreement shall be in place for a period of five years, commencing on September 1, 2022. At the end of this time the agreement shall be reviewed for potential renewal.

Both parties agree to hold an annual review of the agreement on or about the renewal date.
